Oldway Primary is one of the first teaching schools in the country

A primary school in Paignton has become one of the first in the country to be selected for an important new role aimed at raising standards.

Oldway Primary School is one of only 100 schools in England to be granted teaching school status - a new designation entitling it to lead the training and professional development for staff.

It was selected by the National College for School Leadership, which had about 1,200 expressions of interest in the first recruitment round.

The milestone marks a shift towards school-centred training and development. Teaching schools will be responsible for leading a group of schools, working with other partners including at least one university, to deliver high quality support for teachers and leaders at all stages in their career.

Headteacher, Pete Maunder said: "I am delighted with this designation which will enable us to build upon our partnership working with the Local Authority and other schools in the South West. We will meet with our strategic partners in September to ensure that this key DfE initiative will have a positive impact on pupils across Torbay and the South West."

The National College has responsibility for the designation and quality of the teaching schools programme, working closely with the Department for Education (DfE) and Training and Development Agency for Schools (TDA) as the national

network grows to 500 teaching schools by 2014.

Steve Munby, Chief Executive of the National College, said: "To take on this role, teaching schools like Oldway Primary School need to be among the best in the country - outstanding in their own performance and have a track record of raising standards through school-to-school support.

"Over time teaching schools will harness the finest teaching talent in the profession to drive school improvement, and bring real benefits to pupils. Trainees will learn from the best teachers in action and those who want to step up to more senior leadership positions will be exposed to excellent practice within and beyond their immediate school."

The Aiming High Programme funded Scrapstore PlayPods land in Torbay

Two PlayPods designed to stimulate and encourage children to play in imaginative ways are now available in Brixham and Torquay. The shipping containers are filled with hundreds of scrap objects such as tyres, foam, dressing up clothes and cardboard tubes

A fully accessible PlayPod is sited at Chestnut Heights Primary School playing field in Brixham and is open at lunchtimes for children attending the school and then after school as well in the holidays for children using the Indigos Adventure Playground.

A second PlayPod is based at the Acorn Centre, Barton in Torquay as part of its childcare and youth provision.

Disabled children are often sidelined or isolated and including all children is an ultimate aim of Play Torbay - the organisation which has developed this project. Inclusive play sessions supported by dedicated inclusion staff are going to be offered each week at both settings.

The Acorn Centre and the Torquay group for children with ADHD, TADHDs have joined forces to deliver a PlayPods session at the Acorn Centre's Junior Youth Club on a Friday night 5-7pm - the session is open to children aged 8-11.

The staff at Indigos Adventure Playground in partnership with Chestnut Primary School will be running two inclusive PlayPod sessions every week on Monday and

Friday evenings 4-6pm - the sessions are open to children aged 6-11. The PlayPod will also be available to disabled children, young people and the clubs that support them during the holidays and at the weekend. Chestnut Heights Primary School's accessible toilet and changing facilities will be made available to all disabled service users.



Safer Communities Torbay - Partnership Tasking

Safer Communities Torbay has established Partnership Tasking linked to multi agency Locality Management Teams across Torbay (Paignton & Brixham and Torquay).

The Partnership Tasking aim is to share the challenges of improving quality of life in the community between all responsible partners and solve them in a structured way using all available resources and to communicate the outcomes to the relevant communities.

Locality based working is about raising the standards of delivery of front line services to communities and ensuring a joined up approach to dealing with issues that may involve several departments (or indeed several agencies). It is important that services are provided to those who need them and to the standards that residents need.

Both Locality Management Teams (Paignton & Brixham and Torquay) meet fortnightly. These are operational groups which share intelligence about crime, community safety and quality of life issues in order to plan appropriate responses. Each group has a core membership consisting of representatives from police, health, fire, council, probation, registered social landlords and many more. The group can include other officers and partners as appropriate.

The Locality Management Teams have two objectives:

- To help reduce crime and disorder in line with the aims and objectives of the Safer Communities Strategic Assessment and the PACT priorities.
- To increase confidence and provide public reassurance.

Paignton's Playday fun

More than 500 children and young people enjoyed a free day of fun at this year's Playday event in Paignton.

The event on Wednesday 3 August was one of hundred's being held across the country to celebrate Playday 2011 - a national campaign celebrating children's right to play.

Research released to support the campaign shows activities, which were a part of growing up for parents, seem to be in danger of disappearing:

- 42 per cent of children report they have never made a daisy chain
- 32 per cent have never climbed a tree
- A quarter of children today have never had the simple pleasure of rolling down a hill
- 47 per cent of adults built dens every week as a child, yet 29 per cent of today's children say they have never built a den at all
- A third of children have never played hopscotch
- One in ten children have never ridden a bike

As part of Playday 2011 Torbay Council's Early Years, Play and Childcare Service organised a host of free activities at Paignton Community and Sports College's Waterleat Road site. Children and young people were encouraged to bring a picnic and enjoy lots of activities, including archery, sports coaching, bouncy castle assault courses and pottery. There was chance to meet some exciting animals or sit back, relax and watch the excellent 'Jungle Jim' ventriloquist show.

Councillor Chris Lewis, Executive Lead for Children, Schools and Families, said: "Playing outside and indoors is essential for children's health, wellbeing and their future development. Through play they can learn life and social skills whilst having fun. Playday is a fantastic way of getting communities together to support children's play and encouraging families to find time in their busy lives to play in the fresh air."



Torbay Development Agency's Urban Enterprise Programme helps Brixham Youth Enquiry Service

With its plans to move to larger premises, Brixham Youth Enquiry Service (BYES) a community interest company, needed help with setting itself up more like a business.

BYES plays a central role in the life of Brixham and its families. It has a particular focus on young people aged 11-25, but caters for individuals and groups of people of all ages, offering free information and advice on issues such as housing, benefits, relationships, employment, training and money.

With financial support from Torbay Development Agency (TDA) through its Urban Enterprise Programme, the South West Regional Development Agency and the European Regional Development Fund, social enterprises in Torbay can get the help they need to develop and grow.

Angela Neil, Community Organiser with BYES, said: "Brixham Youth Enquiry Service needed help with setting itself up more like a business when we were looking to expand and move to new, larger premises last year. We didn't automatically think of contacting Business Link but we knew Co-active and they told us about a free advice service for projects and groups, as well as for people who are thinking of setting up a project in a more structured way.

"With Co-active's advice, we are setting up a community interest company to act as a trading arm for the charity to support our local young people. This means we can use income to make sure that the project continues to help our community and can become self-sustaining in the future."

Mayor of Torbay, Gordon Oliver, said: "It is great news that Torbay Development Agency's business support initiatives are helping such a wide range of organisations, including social enterprises such as Brixham Youth Enquiry Service. This is all part of our wider aim to improve the local economy to benefit local people by generating more jobs. I hope to see more of these types of success stories in Torbay, and wish the committed volunteers and staff at BYES continued good fortune in developing their business."

Students bring a touch of 1920s oh la la to local building

Torbay Council has teamed up with art students from South Devon College and Guinness Hermitage to brighten up an area in Torquay town centre for local residents.

A wall within the Guinness Care and Support site, off Tor Hill Road, has been painted using a 1920s French Art Deco theme following a request from local residents to help brighten up the area.

The students are all studying their BTEC Level 3 in Fine Art and initially developed several design concepts based on a seaside theme. The Guinness Hermitage residents chose the final design which has a similar look and feel to some of the designs used on previous English Riviera Tourist Board posters.

Maureen Cunningham, Community Investment Officer, Guinness Hermitage, said: "This has been a great example of all agencies working together to produce a wonderful mural for our residents at Seven Hills Sheltered Scheme - well done to all of those involved."

Executive Lead for Tourism and Environment, Councillor Jeanette Richards, said: "I am delighted that the council was able to put Guinness Housing Trust in touch with the students at South Devon College to form what was a great partnership with positive results for the local residents. They have been able to turn what was a very plain wall into something that really puts a smile on their faces and brightens their day."

Children's team helps to make a difference in Zambia

Crayons? Check. Notepads? Check. Footballs? Check. Children's clothing? Check. Cuddly toys? Check. Ink cartridges? Check.

This was part of Debra Mountford's packing list as she recently travelled to Zambia to undertake some charity work in a feeding centre for orphans and vulnerable children in a village called Mwandwi.

Debra works for the Integrated Joint Agency Children's Disability Services (IJACDS), and when they found out she was going to Zambia, they raised £90 from a raffle and also donated £75 which the team had won in a Customer Service Excellence award. The money was used to sponsor a young person through education for two years (£70 per year) with the remaining £25 being spent on some sweets and toys which were handed out during Debra's visit.

Debra has visited Mwandwi three times now; the first time in 2007 and again in 2009 and 2011. She said: "It is a place that you fall in love with and it's like a magnet! Each visit has been very different, with the list of tasks to complete ranging from painting buildings, helping serve the children, doing arts and crafts with the children, reading with and to the children, leading prayers, auditing the accounts and accompanying children to a special residential school."

Debra is always trying to raise awareness, and funds, and has so far arranged for eight young people to be sponsored to go to school or college! These young people are sponsored by Debra, her family and friends.

Debra and her husband plan to return again in 2013, and have already started to save for the trip. Fundraising events will continue to purchase items which the charity requests and to enable more young people to attend school or college.
